**David Rivera**  
**United States Attorney, Middle District of Tennessee**

David Rivera is the United States Attorney for the Middle District of Tennessee. As the District's chief federal law enforcement officer, Mr. Rivera supervises the prosecution of all federal crimes and the litigation of civil matters in which the federal government is a party. The United States Attorney's Office serves a district encompassing 32 counties, including the state capitol, Nashville, with over 2.3 million residents.

He has previously served as an Assistant United States Attorney in the District of Puerto Rico, an Assistant State Attorney in Florida, and an Assistant District Attorney in New York. During his tenure as an Assistant U.S. Attorney, Mr. Rivera has served as the First Assistant United States Attorney, overseeing the operations of the United States Attorney's Office, including the growing Affirmative Civil Enforcement, Health Care Fraud and Economic Fraud initiatives. He has also served as the Chief of the Criminal Division and was responsible for the District's Anti-Terrorism Advisory Council, involving National Security matters, and the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Force.

Mr. Rivera has over 25 years of experience as a trial attorney and has extensive litigation and courtroom experience. As an AUSA, he prosecuted a broad spectrum of criminal matters and received awards and commendations for investigations and prosecutions of Public Corruption, Financial Crimes and the prosecution of International Money Laundering and Drug Trafficking criminal organizations in the United States, South America and the Caribbean.

Mr. Rivera has served as faculty at the U.S. Department of Justice's National Advocacy Center in Columbia, S.C., and has served in advisory and training initiatives in Mexico on behalf of the Department of Justice's Office of Overseas Prosecutorial Development, Assistance and Training. He has twice received the Department of Justice's prestigious Director's Award for Superior Performance as an Assistant United States Attorney, in 2004 and again in 2009, for prosecution of public corruption and economic fraud cases.
